Updated Student Information

At the start of a new school year it is important for any medical plans to be updated and submitted to the school so that we have the most up to date documents to assist your child if needed. If anything has changed in these documents please let us know at the office and even have a chat with your classroom teacher.

Extreme Weather

With the hot weather around in Term 1 please ensure your child has a hat, refillable drink bottle for water and sunscreen applied when necessary. Please also check out our school website for information about what we need to do in the case of an extreme or catastrophic weather event. This Sunday is predicted to be extreme weather for Bendigo and the school may be closed for all staff and community. You may see some signs out around the school if this occurs over the weekend and you are driving past.

COVID-19

Unfortunately Covid is still around in the community, as a school, we need to ensure our learning environment minimises risk as much as possible.

You can help us keep our school as safe as possible by taking 2 important steps:

- 1. Ensure your COVID-19 vaccinations are up to date. Information on how and where to get vaccinated is available on the Get vaccinated webpage.
- 2. If your child shows symptoms of COVID-19, please ensure they stay home and get tested. The easiest way to test is to use a rapid antigen test (RAT).

Free RATs are available from your local council where you can collect 2 packs of 5 RATs and an extra 2 packs for each person in your household. People with disability and their carers can get 4 packs of 5 RATs. You are not required to have a Medicare card and you can collect RATs as many times as you need. You can also buy RATs at supermarkets, pharmacies and other retailers.

If your child has symptoms but tests negative, please ensure they stay home until they no longer have symptoms. If the RAT test result is positive, please ensure they say home for at least 5 days and until there are no more symptoms.

Protecting against mosquito-borne diseases

Warm and wet weather can result in greater numbers of mosquitoes and increased risk of illnesses from mosquito bites. While the overall risk is low, some mosquitoes carry diseases that make people sick.

The best protection against mosquito-borne illness is to avoid mosquito bites.

Whipstick Whispers

Families can protect against mosquito bites by:

- · covering up as much as possible with long, loose-fitting, light-coloured clothing
- · applying insect repellent that contains picaridin or DEET on exposed skin when leaving home
- · limiting outdoor activity if lots of mosquitoes are active.

Families with any health concerns should see their doctor or phone NURSE-ON-CALL: 1300 606 024 (available 24 hours). Free Japanese encephalitis vaccines. Japanese encephalitis virus is spread to humans through bites from infected mosquitoes and can cause a rare but potentially serious infection of the brain. Free Japanese encephalitis vaccines are available to protect Victorians at higher risk of the virus.

The Victorian Department of Health encourages eligible people who live or work in high-risk local government areas to get vaccinated.

For more information, including what is considered a high-risk area and eligibility for a free vaccine, refer to the Department of Health's Japanese encephalitis webpage.

New families to the school might not be aware of this requirement and what this means, so please ask if you are unsure. Welcome back everyone! We are so happy to see you!

The Grade 5/6 students and their teachers have spent a wonderful week together, building relationships, setting up class routines and working on school expectations. Over the first ten days of Term 1, classes will continue to work with our school's Respect Values of: Self, Others, Learning, Environment.

In **Reading**, students have focused on the Reader's Notebook and Reading Workshops. They have begun to demonstrate their understanding of workshops, their importance, roles of students/staff in each session and set up their classroom library.



Bendigo City Council

Parking and Animal Services from the City of Greater Bendigo have contacted our school and requested that the following information be conveyed to our school community. The illegal parking of vehicles adjacent to our school poses a safety concern to children, pedestrians and other road users. Parents are reminded that it is essential to comply with parking restrictions when dropping off and collecting children from school. Motorists must not stop in no stopping areas, even briefly, with or without the motor running. They must not stop next to a continuous yellow edge line, on resident's nature strips, too close to school crossings, park over driveways or double park. A number of schools have short term time restricted areas, such as 2 minute pick up drop off. These parking areas are in place to allow for ease of access close to schools and these restrictions must be adhered to. Drivers should also be aware that they cannot perform a U-turn over an unbroken or continuous dividing line.

With regard to children's crossings, the law requires that a driver approaching a children's crossing must drive at a speed at which the driver can, if necessary stop safely before the crossing. Please slow down and take extra care when driving in school zones.

City of Greater Bendigo Parking Officers and Bendigo Police do conduct random patrols throughout the school year at various locations to ensure that motorists are adhering to the Road Rules.
