Principals Column

No newsletter last week due to a relocation and then another one yesterday. I would like to thank our school community again for your support, flexibility and patience as we work through this relatively new process and requirement. Thanks to those parents who inquired about our BARR rating during the week, I am more than happy to answer any questions. I have included some further information about CAT 1 & 2 schools, which we are categorised as, and also included what a CAT 3 would look like. The purpose of our relocations is to ensure the safety of our school community. This information below will also be placed on our school website for future reference.



Bushfire Category Descriptors – Bushfire At Risk Register (BARR)

CAT3: Wholly in a BPA. Has a Shelter in Place (SIP) onsite that is fire resistant. In catastrophic conditions, likely that SIP will fail. No adequate outside means to access SIP when fire is catastrophic. Is on the BARR, will close on declared Catastrophic Fire Days in fire weather district.

CAT 1 and 2: Under extreme risk. Has a Shelter in Place (SIP) onsite that is fire resistant. In extreme conditions, likely that SIP will fail. No adequate outside means to access SIP when fire is extreme. Will relocate/planned closure when an extreme fire danger is declared in the Local Government Area, will close on declared Catastrophic Fire Days in fire weather district.

Grade 5/6 News

Week 5 is almost done already, time really flies when you are having fun learning! Classrooms are running like well oiled machines. It's great to see so many students being organised on a daily basis, with their diaries, homework, hats and computers. Keep up the great work.

In **Reading** Week 4, we focused our attention on character development within Fictional texts. Students worked on summarising the importance of characters and identifying their personality traits.

In **Writing** Week 4, we continued our Sound Waves journey, moving into lessons and follow up work. During Genre Writing the focus has been on Narrative writing structure and language features that improve the experience for the reader.

In **Maths** Week 4, we were busy. We built on our Place Value knowledge- working closely with Decimal Numbers. We also extended our skills with Rounding to higher numbers and also estimation with measurement. Finally we moved into our Fractions unit, which fits nicely with Decimal Place Value. Plenty of games along the way to keep us engaged.

School Wide Positive Support sessions this year have started very well. Classes have used Smiling Mind to focus their attention on sounds, their bodies and the importance of using these skills in everyday life. Camp! What a fun experience. Students have been able to build on their interpersonal and intrapersonal skills during various activities. It was great to see how they approached each new challenge in their own way, building on confidence along the way. Students change their books each Monday. They are levelled books that the teacher allocated based on assessments with the student. One book goes home each night in the reader bag. Student diaries need to be written in and signed daily.

Grade 1/2 News

We are now half way through Term 1 and what a busy half term it's been! We would like to thank families for their understanding on the days when we have needed to relocate due to the extreme weather. Adapting to change can be difficult but it does help to build on our resilience.

Reading: During our shared reading time the classes have been revisiting our tricky words. We have also been looking closely at the first, middle and end sounds of words as we are reading and talking a lot about reading fluency. Students have been thoroughly enjoying reading a variety of pig the pug books as well as books focused on our integrated topic on healthy eating.

Top home reading tip: The students are being asked to read at least one just right book at home with an adult each night. Home reading also needs to be recorded in student's diaries so that we can monitor reading progress. We are hoping that all students will receive many reading nights awards throughout the year. Reading at home every night is extremely important in grades 1 & 2, it is when students generally make the most reading progress to set themselves up for their future education. One on one guidance will have a significant impact on reading progress.

Writing: For the last 2 weeks, we have been focusing on Description and using the description bubble. Students have engaged in drawing a pig the pug character and describing it in their writing. We have also been describing a variety of fruit. Our spelling focus has been on the e and ea sound as in (e for egg) as well as 'd and dd'.

Numeracy: This week, we been looking at teen numbers and how we make them using the base 10 wooden blocks. Classes have also completed a pre test on essential assessment on fractions and will start learning more about fractions today.

Inquiry: This week we are continuing to focus on the school values and expectations with a lot of class discussion as well as starting our integrated topic on healthy eating.



SENTRAL Parent Portal App Tips


If your child/ren is going to be Absent for any reason you can submit the Absence on our SENTRAL Parent Portal by using the Absences tile.


