
As I was walking around the 1/2 area this week I saw some Science activities happening. This is a great initiative and something I know Mr Morton would love to see. Well done all.







Grade 1/2 News

Reading

During our shared reading time the classes have been revisiting our tricky words. We have also been thinking about the main idea of what we have read. Students have been thoroughly enjoying reading a variety of Non-Fiction texts focused on our integrated topic on healthy eating.

Top home reading tip

The students are being asked to read at least one just right book at home with an adult each night. Home reading also needs to be recorded in student's diaries so that we can monitor reading progress. We are hoping that all students will receive many reading nights awards throughout the year. Reading at home every night is extremely important in Grades 1 & 2, it is when students generally make the most reading progress to set themselves up for their future education. One on one guidance will have a significant impact on reading progress. A great strategy after reading is to talk about what was read to assist with comprehension.



Writing

This week we have continued to focus on Description and using the Description Bubble. Our spelling focus has been on 'o' and 'oa'.

Numeracy

This week, we been looking at ordering numbers from 0-20, 0-100 and 0-1000 through a range of activities and later in the week we will start to look at chance.

Inquiry

This week we have continued our integrated topic on healthy eating.

Not long now until the school holidays. Students have had a wonderful start to their schooling and it is hard to believe their first term is nearly complete. Below are photos of learning this week, included is a hunt around the school for different shapes, making birthday cakes and discussing the idea of more and less. Well done to our wonderful learners.





This week in the Prep rooms

Phonics – students learnt two new letter sounds this week. Bb and Hh. We have been working on phoneme awareness and hearing the first sound in words.





Reading – we have continued discussing where to find

the front cover of a book, where to find the title and which direction we read the text. We have been reading decodable texts and modelling how to blend words together.

Writing – students have continued to practise their pencil grip and forming letters correctly. They have attempted to write a sentence about the picture they have drawn and using heart words within the sentences.

Maths' - students have been focusing on the language of more and less. They have been looking at two collections and deciding which one has more and which one has less. They made birthday cakes from playdough and placed candles on the cakes, modelling which cakes had more and which had less. Students have also been recognising shapes and sorting the shapes based on their features.

Integrated – students have been discussing the idea of bravery and what it means to be brave and how this can help us at school and at home.


SENTRAL Parent Portal App Tips
